

Bob Cotter is the Planning Director for Jersey City, a position he has held for more than 25 years (and 11 mayors). Under his direction, Jersey City has adopted more than 80 redevelopment plans, including the National Planning Award winning plan for Jersey City's Martin Luther King Drive. The New Jersey Chapter of the American Planning Association has recognized Bob and his staff with many awards for their excellent work over the past 30 years.
