



Daniel Zarrilli is the Director of Resiliency for the City of New York, leading the implementation of *A Stronger, More Resilient New York*, the City's efforts to improve resiliency by strengthening coastal protections, upgrading buildings, improving infrastructure, and making neighborhoods safer and more vibrant.
